Dunshaughlin/Culmullen Parish has implemented the following changes in response to Government guidelines; The Churches will remain closed for the Celebration of Masses, People cannot be admitted. Church open for prayer all day everyday from 8 am till 8 pm

Baptisms; suspended until further notice

Funerals; Attendance at funerals is now limited to 10 people, we realise this will cause difficulties for bereaved families. Families are asked to liaise with the Priest in relation to these limited numbers. **Please note restrictions apply in the open air as well.**

Weddings; limited to 6 people.

Please adhere to the two meter distancing rule, on entering the Churches use sanitizing liquid if you pick up a leaflet, paper or prayer card please return it to its place or take it with you. **As a courtesy to others please do not leave it on seats.**

New Archbishop of Dublin

We congratulate Most Reverend Dermot Farrell, priest of our Diocese, formerly Parish Priest of Dunboyne on his appointment as the new Archbishop of Dublin, we pray for him as he begins his ministry there.

Pope Francis appealed for a “culture of care” in his message for the 2021 World Day of Peace.

“The culture of care ... calls for a common, supportive and inclusive commitment to protecting and promoting the dignity and good of all, a willingness to show care and compassion, to work for reconciliation and healing, and to advance mutual respect and acceptance. As such, it represents a privileged path to peace,” Pope Francis wrote in the peace message. “May we never yield to the temptation to disregard others, especially those in greatest need, and to look the other way; instead, may we strive daily, in concrete and practical ways, to form a community: composed of brothers and sisters who accept and care for one another.”

The Pope highlighted the principles of care for the dignity and rights of each person, care for the common good, care through solidarity, and care and protection of creation. “This will enable us to esteem the value and dignity of every person, to act together in solidarity for the common good and to bring relief to those suffering from poverty, disease, slavery, armed conflicts, and discrimination. I ask everyone to take this compass in hand and to become a prophetic witness of the culture of care, working to overcome the many existing social inequalities
