The Fruits of the Holy Spirit

Today fifty days after Easter, we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit, the third person of the Trinity. The Spirit of truth, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, rests on the Apostles and those gathered huddled and afraid in an upper room in Jerusalem.
