This year marks the 400th Anniversary of the birth of St Oliver at Oldcastle; he was born on the 15th November 1625.

This year also marks the 50th Anniversary of his canonisation in 1975.

To celebrate this occasion Bishop Tom Deenihan will celebrate Holy Mass with the priests of the Diocese at Loughcrew, Oldcastle, on Sunday 29th June at 3 pm.

Archbishop Eamonn Martin, Primate of All Ireland and successor of St Oliver will preach the sermon. All are welcome.
