Bishops Pastoral

Bishop Tom Deenihan has written a Pastoral Letter to all this Sunday.

The Bishop addresses current challenges facing Parishes in the Diocese.



The Pastoral is entitled "The Future of our Parishes, communities of Belonging and Evangelisation"

Some points in summary from the Pastoral Letter:

The Parish is a place of belonging; it is a community of faith.

It is the place where the Sacraments are available and where we celebrate our faith.

The Bishop addresses "Current challenges for our Parishes"

The number of priests in the Diocese is decreasing and the age profile of those who are working is increasing. There are over 130 Churches in the Diocese. While plans are put in place to address the shortage of priests, the Bishop asserts 'no Church will be closed'.

There may however be parishes without a resident priest. The plan is to ensure that Parishes continue to offer pastoral care even when this is the case.

To this end, Parishes will be formed into pastoral areas, groups of three or four parishes working together. Every Church will continue to have Mass on Saturday evening and Sunday. The Parish will continue to be a place of Pastoral Care and evangelisation.

Parish Pastoral Councils have been set up across the Diocese. The Bishop asks them to work together to share resources.

"The Parish deepens its sense of identity as the Body of Christ when it celebrates the Sunday Eucharist"

The Pastoral Areas will ensure that each parish community can gather for Sunday Mass. Priests will be called on to supply for absent colleagues, due to illness or bereavement. The Parish Pastoral Councils in the Pastoral Area are asked to begin looking at Mass times and possible reduction of Masses. It may be necessary to reduce the number of Masses in a Parish in order to ensure every Church has a Sunday Mass. *The Bishop concludes* "May the Christ the Good Sheppard accompany us and inspire as we continue that task".
